Golf Course News



This month the golf course maintenance team will be working on the detailing around the course. We will be spraying native areas & applying pine straw to



the areas of need. The turf areas on the course are looking good & starting to grow more consistently with the warmer weather. We will also begin our liquid fertility/PGR programs for all of the Tee, Fairway, & Rough areas. These are all typical & highly used programs for golf courses to be maintained to the highest standards.

Some bigger projects we have coming up are repairing some drainage areas & washouts. This includes the area from number 7 cart path all the way to 11. The plan is to have a contractor come in & change the slopes & sod these places for a much cleaner look. We have consulted with multiple contractors & engineers & believe this is our best course of action.

After the work gets started on the drainage repair project, the same contractor will start on our bunker renovation. The start of the project will include our worst & highest face bunkers. Bunkers to include number 1,9,10,13,14,15, & 18. These bunkers are some of the highest sand face bunkers & come into play more frequently. This will be a full-face lift for these bunkers. First, we will remove the current sand from the bunkers. Then reshape & add new drain lines. Next, we will use the Capillary Concrete Bunker liner rolled out smooth & add the new bunker sand. The Capillary Concrete Bunkers are some of the best in the world. They provide excellent drainage from rain to prevent washouts, while also providing a more consistent playing surface.

These are two very big projects that will be going on during play. Please excuse our progress & be mindful of the workers around you while playing. We do not have a start date yet, but we have locked down a golf course contractor who comes with great recommendations & reviews. As soon as we have more details on a start date the membership will be updated.



From barnstormer to Georgia's first aviatrix to a WW II WASP, Hazel Jane Raines' unbelievable heroic life unfolds in Mueller's newest true story. Diminutive Hazel Raines was the first female to obtain a pilot's license in Georgia. She logged 6,400 flight hours during her 20 years of flying, including World War II, where she flew with England's Royal Air Force, because her own country was not employing female pilots. Returning to the U.S., she became a WASP, and flew until that organization was disbanded. Then she joined the Third Air Force and flew during the Korean War. When she received an opportunity to teach pilots in Brazil, she enthusiastically learned Portuguese and moved to Sao Paolo for this new adventure. Hazel joined the Women's Army Corp and eventually returned to England, embarking on top-secret missions to NATO bases across Europe. Hers was a life shaped by bravery, intelligence, and charm, as well as the political and social challenges of the day.



Test your knowledge of the Rules of Golf on Match Play

The answers are on page 12.

- <u>Rule 5.2 a</u> In preparing for his match with Player B, Player A decides to practice a few putts on the 18th green while waiting for Player B to show up for their 9:00am Tee Time.
 - <u>A)</u> There is no penalty.

<u>**B)**</u> Player A is penalized two strokes.

<u>C)</u> Player A is penalized for the loss of one hole. .

- Rule 6.1 b On hole #12, the green and blue tee markers are set fairly close to one another. Player B had the honors and hit from the blue tee (wrong tee, as they were playing green tees). Player A did not see Player B as he was busy getting his driver out. When Player A went to the green tee to play, Player B told Player A what happened.
 - A) Player A should join Player B and play the blue tee..
 - B) Player B loses the 12th hole..
 - <u>C)</u> Player A has a choice: tell Player B to hit again from the green tee, or "no
 - problem" play it. (No penalty in either case).
- Rule 6.3 d Player A and B can not decide on a ruling concerning a ball that Player A dropped from a penalty area, which came to rest in the relief area but the player has to stand in the penalty area (water) to make a play . Player A decides to play 2 balls (one as it lies, and a second one dropped in the relief area where he is not standing in the penalty area) and get a ruling from the Pro Shop when they finish.
 - <u>A)</u>No penalty other than 1 stroke for dropping from penalty area, and 2nd ball dropped counts.
 - <u>B)</u>No penalty other than 1 stroke for dropping from penalty area, and 1st ball counts.
 - <u>C)</u> Player A loses the hole for playing 2 balls, which constitutes playing a wrong ball.

Answers to Quiz on Page 12:

#1 Answer is "A". In match play, a player may practice on the course on the day of competition, before or after play.

#2 Answer is "C". In match play, a player may begin a hole from the wrong tee marker without penalty, but his opponent may cancel the stroke and require the player to tee off from the correct tee without penalty, or let the play stand without penalty. This must be decided before anyone else makes a stroke.

#3 Answer is "C". The privilege of playing two balls is in stroke play only. Player B plays a wrong ball when he played the second ball and loses the hole at that point.

Jonsson Finishes T17 at NCAA Regional

AUBURN, Ala. – <u>Tobias Jonsson</u> finished tied for 17th at the NCAA Auburn Regional, representing Mercer as the fourth-seeded individual competitor.

Jonsson, making his second NCAA tournament appearance, was the second-lowest scoring individual player. He finished with a score of +2 (218) across the three days. Round three was his best performance as Jonsson posted a -1 (71) score on the day.

Lady Bears Finish Third With Two In Top 10 at

NGI Tournament

MARICOPA, Ariz. - The Mercer women's golf team concluded its postseason tournament in third place out of 10 teams at the NGI Tournament. The Bears finished 26-over, 890 for the tournament. <u>Mikayla Dubnik</u> and <u>Camilla Järvelä</u> each finished tied for sixth place at 3-over 219 at the NGI Tournament from Ak-Chin Southern Dunes Golf Club.

Järvela was one of the best golfers on the par 3's for the tournament as she was 1-over on them, third best among the 48-player field. Dubnik was right behind her at 2-over for the tournament on par 3's. Dubnik also performed well on the par 5's where she averaged 4.67 strokes and was 4-under on them, tied for second best in the field. Dubnik had 12 birdies over the 54-hole tournament, tied for the most among all golfers. Järvelä's 39 pars were tied for second most in the field. **Carol Pyon** had the lowest final round for the Bears with an even-par 72 on Sunday and moved her up 10 spots on the final leaderboard at tied for 16th.
