Golf Shop News



Summertime is here. The Pool and the Golf Course are open for you to enjoy.

The hot summer months can play havoc on trying to hit good golf shots with a sweaty golf glove & worn out/slick grips. Come see us at the golf shop & take advantage of buy 3 get 4th glove free sale. Are your grips slick and worn out, drop them off with us & we'll regrip your clubs with a fast turn-around.

July 4th Tuesday, the golf shop will have the Flag Day Event from 8am-12pm. Cost is \$5. The format will be individual stroke play using 85% HDCP. How it works: Pay \$5 & receive your flag & we'll put your name on it. The furthest flags in the ground are winners. GHIN index converted to Course Handicap using 85% = Course Handicap. Ex. Index converts to a 10 CH, 85% = 8.5 & rounded up = 9. Par is 72 + 9 = 81. 81st shot is where you place your flag in the ground.

The 2-man Hutch Cup Final is complete. The finals were Larry Wiley/Richard Nixon vs Brad Thigpen/ Larry Thigpen. Richard is out with a collar bone issue, so Larry Wiley played the Thigpens by himself. Larry played very well, but the father/son Thigpen team won 1 UP. The consolation bracket has Brent Orr/Chris Orrison vs Rawls Edwards/Jon Adams. This match has not been played. Check out the bracket results in front of the golf shop.

Tournaments that are available for our members: **(July 8-9 Member-Member)** This is your club's premier tournament. We encourage all club members to participate. We have 40 teams signed up and a full field is 60 teams. The Individual Hutch Cup is scheduled July – September. We will have a Gross Division Bracket & a Net Division Bracket. The Net Division just reached 32 players; tournament information will be sent by end of day, Sunday July 2. Gross Division has 9 of 16 signed up. We'll give it a few more days for signups. **SAVE THE DATE!!!** The Member Guest will be held October 6-8, 2023. Save the date & plan to play in the Brickyard's Premiere event. Signups will begin August 1st.

The Brickyard PGA Junior Golf League is in full effect, & practices are on Thursdays & Matches from 4pm-7pm. The Season started April 1 and ends July 31. We've played 2 of 4 matches. Our next match will be on our home turf against Houston Lake CC on Thursday July 6th at 4pm-7pm.

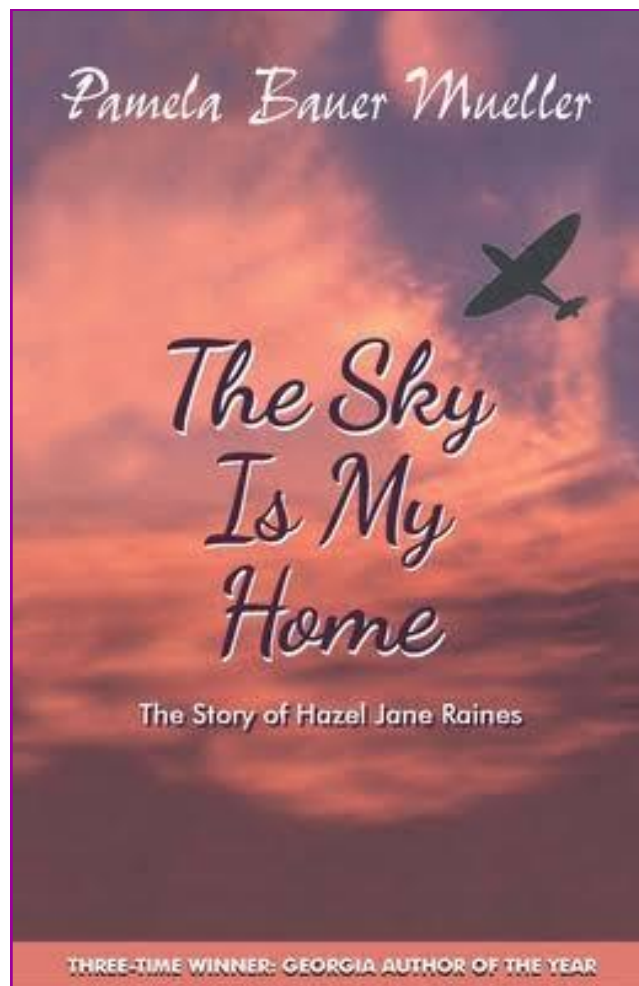
We've updated & cleaned up the online tee time program for your use. Please remember to call or cancel your tee times online if you're not using. Tee Times can be made 10 days out by either calling the golf shop or by reserving a tee time at our website. Please continue signing in at the golf shop before going onto the course. Make sure that when reserving your tee time, either through calling the golf shop or online, you book it for one, two, three, four or five players. This ensures that other members don't book on your tee time when you're expecting more players than what is booked. Lastly, check out the Brickyard website for information & utilize the member login tab. It allows you to make online tee times, view the tee sheets 10 days out & much more. If you need help setting yours up, see the front office ladies & they will get you set up.

July 18th at 5:30pm....*"The Sky is my Home"* by Pamela Mueller

From barnstormer to Georgia's first aviatrix to a WW II WASP, Hazel Jane Raines' unbelievable heroic life unfolds in Mueller's newest true story. The latest in Pamela Bauer Mueller's string of inspiring historical novels brings an unforgettable modern heroine to vivid life. Diminutive Hazel Raines was the first female to obtain a pilot's license in Georgia. She logged 6,400 flight hours during her 20 years of flying, including World War II, where she flew with England's Royal Air Force, because her own country was not employing female pilots. Returning to the U.S., she became a WASP, and flew until that organization was disbanded. Then she joined the Third Air Force and flew during the Korean War. When she received an opportunity to teach pilots in Brazil, she enthusiastically learned Portuguese and moved to Sao Paolo for this new adventure. Hazel joined the Women's Army Corp and eventually returned to England, embarking on top-secret missions to NATO bases across Europe. Hers was a life shaped by bravery, intelligence, and charm, as well as the political and social challenges of the day.



GOLF RULES



Test your knowledge of the Rules of Golf on 4 Ball Stroke Play The answers are on page 16.

- ◆ **Rule 23.5a** During the play of hole #5, player A's ball is in the lake; his partner's ball is on the green. While Player A is deciding what option to take, his partner, Player B, tells Player A that the drop zone would be the best option, and A agreed. While A was getting his club, Player B told A he was dropping a ball for him in the drop zone to speed up play. Player A plays the ball.
 - A) Player A is penalized 2 strokes for playing the wrong ball.
 - B) Player B is penalized two strokes also.
 - C) There is no rule violation.

- ◆ **Rule 23.26/1** After the first round of a four ball stroke play tournament, Teams A & B and C & D, turned in a scorecard that listed a single line score for each team, rather than a two line score which clearly identifies which player's score counted for each team.
 - A) Both teams are disqualified.
 - B) Scores are correct, no problem.
 - C) Each team is penalized 2 strokes to be added to their respective scores.

- ◆ **Rule 12.26 (1)/3.3b (3)** Player A returns a score of 4 & Player B returns a score of 5. Player A incurred a penalty of 2 strokes for touching (accidentally) the sand in a bunker while taking a practice swing; however, neither player was aware of the penalty before returning the scorecard. Upon discovery of the penalty the scoring committee must:
 - A) Add 2 strokes to A's score & count B's 5 as team score for the hole.
 - B) Add 2 strokes to A's ball giving A a 6 for the hole and count A's ball of 6 for the hole.
 - C) Disqualify the side for turning in a score lower than they had for the hole.



Answers to Quiz on Page 15:

#1 Answer is "C". A player may take any action concerning his partner's ball that the partner is allowed to take before making a stroke.

#2 Answer is "A". The sides gross scores for each hole must be clearly identified as the score of the individual partner who made it.

#3 Answer is "B". As they were unaware of the penalty before returning the card, the committee must apply a 2 stroke penalty to A's score, as it was the score to count on the hole. The rule to disqualify is waived as they were unaware of the penalty.
