



#### **Golf Course News**





In the month of August, there are a lot of things going on out on the course. First, construction will begin for repairing the washed out areas from #7 to #11 along the bank edges. This will include both sides of the banks. On the fairway sides of #7, 11, & 12, the bank will be slowly tapered down and sodded with Bermuda grass for a smooth cleaner look and it will give the water more real estate to move over, instead of washing out. On the other side, the bank will have one or two tiers and will be sodded, but with centipede grass or something equivalent. This will be lower maintenance and will require less mowing frequency.

Once the construction is started and moving along, the same contractor will begin our Bunker renovation. The bunker type we will use is called Capillary Concrete. These bunkers will not have the old felt liners in them. If you do a quick google search of <u>Capillary Concrete Bunkers</u>, you can find this is one of the best bunker types in the world. The bunkers we are starting with include #1, 9, 10, 13, 14, 15, & 18. These are the largest and most troublesome bunkers. This process will include removing old sand, installing drainage, removing the high sand faces, and reshaping as needed. After all of this is done, the capillary concrete will be poured into the bottom of the bunkers. This is a mix of rock with little sand to form the bottom areas. This allows for rain and irrigation to flow through with little to no washing out of the edges. Lastly, our sand will be installed, packed, and raked into place.

On another note, July was a very good month on the Greens maintenance program. We were able to verticut and top-dress greens more aggressively than usual. This will help maintain and produce the ballspeed and plant health that we strive for. These are just a few of the cultural practices we use. Another practice we use is Aeration. This process punches a hole in the turf and pulls out a core. Removing a core helps with maintaining and reducing the thatch layer and helps with water/moisture management. We will then put clean sand out to fill the holes. This process does disturb the playability but with the tine size we are using and weather patterns, we expect a quick recovery. This process will take place on August 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>.

As construction is taking place, we will be open for play. Please be courteous and cautious to these workers. We apologize for the inconvenience, but we are doing these things to improve the Brickyard Golf Course.

It was a 4-month program that included instruction and 2-person scramble competition against Houston Lake Country Club and Southern Landings Golf Club. I want to thank the juniors, all the parents, grandparents, and my staff for all their time and help with the program. We hope to improve on the 2023 program and make the 2024 program even better. We will start it up again in April of 2024.

We are having an enormous number of good un-broken golf tees being left on the tee boxes each day. The tees are complimentary, and we ask that you please tidy up the tee boxes and pick up all the unbroken tees and re-use these during your rounds or just put them in the golf cart glove compartments and our staff will take care of the tees. It looks nicer on the tee boxes, helps to keep the mower reels sharp and is a benefit of being a member at the Brickyard Golf Club.

Please remember to call or cancel online your tee times if you're not using. Tee Times can be made 10 days out by either calling the golf shop or by reserving a tee time at our website. We've noticed an improvement during the past few months on members signing in at the golf shop. Thank you. Please continue signing in at the golf shop before going onto the course. Make sure that when reserving your tee time, either through calling the golf shop or online, you book it for one, two, three, four or five players. This ensures that other members don't book on your tee time when you're expecting more players than what is booked.






## Test your knowledge of the Rules of Golf on Stroke Play The answers are on page 16.

- ♦ Rule 14.3c Player A taking relief from a cart path drops a ball properly in the relief area. After hitting the ground in the relief area, the ball hits the club that player A used to measure the relief area. The ball came to rest in the relief area. Which is correct?
  - A) Player A must drop again, with no penalty.
  - B) The ball is in play with no penalty.
  - C) Player A must start again and measure a new relief area.
- ♠ Rule 14.7b(2) Player B is uncertain if his ball is in an abnormal course condition, so he declares he will play 2 balls, and get a ruling after play. He scores 4 with each ball. Which is correct?
  - <u>A)</u> Player B turns in scorecard with 4 marked as his score, and does not bother to ask for a ruling. No penalty.
  - <u>B)</u> Player B should declare which ball he wishes to count before he makes a stroke. He must report to the committee the facts, regardless of the score, with the two balls before returning his scorecard, or he is DQ.
  - <u>C)</u> Player B receives a two stroke penalty for not declaring which ball was to count, if played by the rules.
- ♦ <u>Rule 16.2a</u> Suzie shanks her ball into a penalty area and is close to a snake she sees. Wishing to get relief from the snake, she seeks a ruling from her 3 fellow competitors. Which of the rulings is correct?
  - <u>A)</u> Drop a ball at the nearest point she feels comfortable, no nearer the hole, but must stay in the penalty area. No penalty.
  - <u>B)</u> Drop a ball outside the penalty area, two club lengths from where the ball last crossed the penalty area line. Penalty of one stroke.
  - <u>C)</u> If she drops the two club lengths outside the penalty area (as in B), but is still in fear of the snake, she may, at no additional penalty, drop a ball as far away as necessary to make her feel safe, but no nearer the hole.
  - **D)** All three above are correct.



#### Answers to Quiz on Page 15:

- #1 Answer is "B". It does not matter whether, after first hitting the ground, the ball hits the person, or his equipment before coming to rest.
- #2 Answer is "B". The player must declare which ball is to count before making a stroke or the original ball counts. Player must report to the committee the facts before returning his scorecard or he is DQ.
- #3 Answer is "D". All three are correct.
