

St. Simons Trilogy

From the sky, there was only a feeling of light. The strength of the clear, magnifying lens of the wheelhouse lantern, showing an arc of twenty points through the compass, was barely enough for navigation on such a night. The clouds hung cloak-like, motionless, heavy with unfallen rain. Familiar landmarks along the twisting inland waterway were almost blotted out. The low, bulky steamer moved, but seemingly toward nothing.

Three of the four passengers aboard the South Carolina had looked forward to a moonlit trip down the coastal waters of Georgia from Darien to St. Simons Island, and south to St. Mary's at the border of the Florida territory. Cheerfully, almost, the three talkative passengers—two men and a woman—had accepted the more-than-two-hour wait for the tide to free the packet from a sandbar on which she grounded after leaving the dock at Darien. When they had come aboard at 3 p.m., the sun had hung bright and high in a flattened dome of hot, August blue. Everyone knew it would be dark long before they reached St. Simons Island, some twenty water miles away, but in such clear summer weather, the full moon would turn the flat stretches of salt marsh, cut for miles around by serpentine coastal rivers and creeks, into an enchanted landscape.

GOLF COURSE NEWS



Out on the course inside the tree lines, we have been busy with watering, mowing, and spraying. All our maintained Bermuda grass including Tees, Fairways and Rough have all been treated for weeds and insect control. Greens will soon be treated as we are changing up the strategy for better winter weed control. On the irrigation side of things, we are continuing to find and repair bad solenoids from lightning storms. We must repair the controllers first, then we are able to see which heads are not working. With the cooler temperature the grass is not growing as much, so we are not mowing as frequently. Also, the (HOC) Height of Cut has been raised on Fairways, Tees and Approaches to allow for some winter fluff and a better playing surface through the winter months.

The project on numbers seven, eleven and twelve is wrapping up and coming together nicely. The sod is being laid and the rock has already been strategically placed. All the areas that received sod have been treated with nutrients and fertilizers. The other areas will get seed and straw.

The Bunker project will start on #14 and we may only be able to get 14 and the practice bunkers completed this year. I have given the contractors a deadline to stop all work in mid-October to give the Bermuda sod going down on bunker faces time to take root and grow together. The last thing we want to do is have a big project with lots of sod and catch a heavy freeze and have the sod die. Bunker faces are some of the driest areas on a golf course and this also increases the chance of winter kill. The crew doing the work will return next spring to early summer to resume work on our bunkers. The maintenance staff will do our best to provide the best playable bunkers until then.

Par 3 tees and the driving range tee will be overseeded soon as well. Please fill your divots with the sand provided to help a speedy recovery of these areas.

Mizuno Fitting Day is scheduled for Friday October 13th 12pm-4pm. We will have a Certified Mizuno Fitter using a Launch Monitor to accurately fit you for Woods or Irons. Sign up by calling or stopping by the golf shop. This is a member benefit, members receive 10% off on all purchases, and by far the best way to correctly purchase new Mizuno Golf Clubs.

We will be hosting a Junior Tour Event presented by Under Armour in the Middle Georgia League on December 3rd. This will be played on a Sunday afternoon, playing the Back 9 holes 10-18 and beginning at 1:30pm. Details can be found at www.uagolftour.com. This event last year featured 7 of our club members playing. This event will have an effect only Holes 10-18 from 1:30pm till the end of day. Member play will be limited to playing only the Front 9 Holes 1-9 from 1:30pm till end of day.

The Brick Cup Finale, featuring the top 32 Point Getters for the 2023 Member Events, will be held on Saturday November 11th. Once the Member Guest is played, point totals will be updated, and 2 Captains will be selected, and each Captain's team will have 16 Players. A Pairings Party will take place in the Pavilion featuring each Captain selecting and announcing their Match Pairings. This will be a lot of fun and a great ending to a terrific year of events.

GOLF RULES



Test your knowledge of the Rules of Golf

The answers are on page 16.

- ◆ **Rule 6.1.b(1)** During match play, Player A hits her tee shot from the wrong teeing area. Player B hits her tee shot from the same wrong teeing area, and her ball goes out of bounds. Player B takes the stroke and distance penalty and re-tees her ball and hits. Player A lies 1 and Player B lies 3. Which is correct at this point?
 - A) Both players should start again from the correct teeing area under penalty of two strokes.
 - B) Both balls are in play, and they should continue playing the hole.
 - C) Player B claims the hole as A was first to hit from the wrong teeing area.
 - D) Player A claims the hole as B played from the wrong place when she played her stroke and distance shot teed up instead of dropped.

- ◆ **Rule 4.2.a(1)2** After playing 3 holes, Player A discovers that Player B is playing with Titleist Pro V1 balls with "practice" written on the side. Player A claims that is a non conforming ball- Which is correct?
 - A) Player B claims the balls are perfectly legal.
 - B) Player B is penalized two strokes for each hole played and must discontinue playing that ball.
 - C) Player B is disqualified.

- ◆ **Rule 14.3b(4)** Player A is taking relief from a penalty area, places his ball within two club lengths in the general area from where his ball last crossed the margin of the penalty area, no closer to the hole and plays it. In addition to the one stroke penalty for relief from the penalty area, which of the following is correct?
 - A) Player A has a two stroke penalty for placing the ball instead of dropping the ball.
 - B) Player A has a one stroke penalty for placing the ball instead of dropping it.
 - C) Player A must cancel the stroke and proceed correctly with a two stroke penalty.
